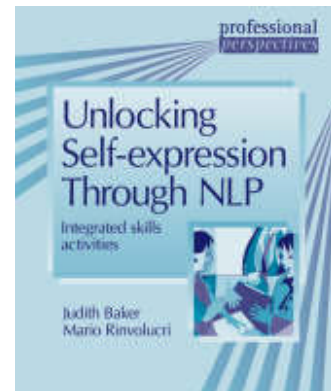
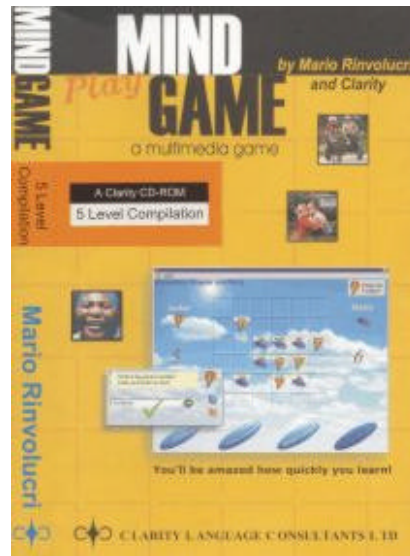
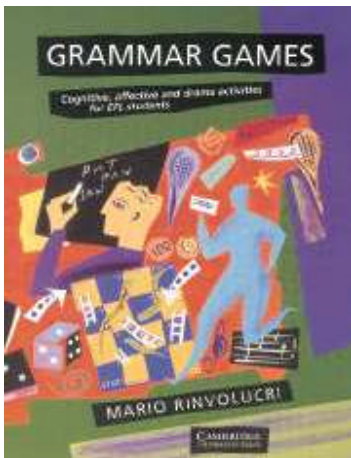


TESL Toronto is pleased to present our 2007 Keynote Speaker – *Mario Rinvoluceri*



Keynote Address **Humanistic Teaching - What is it?**

After an opening warm-up exercise taken from the work of Bernard Dufeu, Mario will look at the theoretical foundations of humanistic teaching as seen in the writings of Carl Rogers, Earl Stevick and Sylvia Ashton Warner.

The main part of the presentation will explore what neuro-linguistic programming (NLP) and Howard Gardner's theory of multiple intelligences have to offer the student-centred teacher. Mario will do one or two exercises from these areas so the theory is illuminated by practical experience. You will leave the lecture hall with clear ideas and practical techniques you can use the following Monday!

Mario Rinvoluceri is a teacher, teacher trainer and author. He has worked for Pilgrims, UK for 32 years and has published several resource books for ESL teachers which reflect his interest in exploring multiple intelligences, neuro-linguistic programming and humanizing the classroom.
